The incumbent will focus primarily on; influencing public policy makers to achieve optimal health outcomes for Canadians; demonstrating the impact of advocacy positions on policy development of the federal government and including patient involvement in the decision-making process.

- Working in collaboration with internal and external stakeholders (healthcare professionals, academics, elected officials, senior government representatives, and industry) to disseminate the organization's position, build consensus, promote change and call to action.
- Representing the organization at meetings with external stakeholders.
- On behalf of the organization, speaking at conferences and workshops, disseminating information and promoting the organization's policy position.

## **Required Skills:**

- Master's degree from a recognized university in health sciences, economics or social sciences or an equivalent combination of education, training and experience.
- Three years of policy analysis experience in a relevant field.
- Demonstrated experience in patient engagement initiatives.
- Ability to research, interpret and disseminate quantitative/qualitative literature and identify potential implications for policy and practice pertinent to health .
- Demonstrated success working within interdisciplinary teams and in partnerships with groups such as policy-makers, researchers, advocates and service providers with excellent relationship-building skills.
- Knowledge of and experience with project management.
- Ability to draft meaningful policies and recommendations and write impactful narratives from data and supporting evidence.
- Preferred Not-for-Profit experience.
- Demonstrated ability to research, study and interpret policy information options and develop policy options/proposals.
- The ability to support the design and implementation of complex policy initiatives and to access and synthesize information on various topics.
- Consensus-building, consultation and negotiations skills.
- Understanding of health policy issues and health policy development processes through a history of involvement in/or knowledge of government.
- Ability to conceptualize easily, learn quickly and independently exercise good judgement and demonstrate initiative.



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- Excellent communication skills, both verbal and written.
- Ability to translate knowledge and expertise for a variety of audiences.
- Superior report-writing and presentation skills.
- Ability to participate and contribute effectively as part of a team.
